

Dear Friends,

The church year is wonderful and full of celebrations. Having celebrated the Feast of the Blessed Trinity, I could not help but remember the way a friend once taught me to say the 'Glory Be'.

I was encouraged to say: "BE Glory to the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit". I pray I can live up to that version!

Someone who has truly been glory to the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit is Mary. I recently conducted a retreat day at Enders Island with the theme of "Mary: The First Tabernacle". It was very timely and appreciated by the participants, as we are coming to the end of the year of Eucharistic Revival for the Parish. The feast of Corpus Christi leads us into the third year of the Eucharist Revival with the theme of Going Forth, Being Mission.

During my research for the retreat, I found a wonderful statement that resonated deeply with me. It read: "Mary's journey to Elizabeth was the first Eucharistic procession." Wow! Isn't that powerful?

As this specific year of Eucharistic Revival comes to a close, that quote really struck me. In my daily comings and goings, do I bring the Jesus within me to others, or am I in too much of a hurry?

Perhaps I might be the only 'God' presence the person may experience. What helps me remember that I am taking Jesus with me no matter where I go? If I am always rushing, how can I slow down? What helps me remain aware that in being the face of Jesus, I am to be the face of compassion and understanding?

If Mary was the First Eucharistic procession, then I am presently the continuation of the same. How well do I express it? Do I have a smile on my face, kindness and compassion in my heart, and purpose in my soul?

Only you can answer those questions for yourself.

Just found this quote from Muhammad Ali that speaks of the theme of the third year of the Eucharistic Revival Year of Mission: "Service to others is the rent you pay for your room here on Earth".

Be of service and bring the love of the Eucharist to all. Spend time this week noticing how you bring Jesus to others. Each step taken towards another is bringing Jesus closer to them, after all. Perhaps they will even bring Jesus to YOU!



Peter went to St. Catherine of Siena Hospital in December 2022 with a stomach pain that ended up being a life-threatening intestinal issue and fell into critical condition. He was hospitalized for 3 months, the majority of which was spent in Intensive Care Unit. During his stay Peter underwent multiple procedures and over the course of his stay received numerous transfusions requiring over 35 units of blood.

Peter was ultimately discharged to a Skilled Nursing Facility where, a year later, he is still currently trying to recover. Please donate in his honor.

10th Sunday of Ordinary Time

June 9, 2024: Gn 3:9-15 | Ps 130:1-8 | 2 Cor 4:13 - 5:1 | Mk 3:20-35

Pray: Jesus, Lover of my Soul, guide and hold me steady in Christ's family of faith. Amen.

We are family ... my brothers, sisters, and me!

Jesus asks in this week's Gospel, "Who are my mother, brothers, and sisters?" At first glance, this

seems odd considering his relatives were at home with Him. We must understand that Jesus had His mother there, along with some of His close cousins and relatives (whom, in those days, it was customary to call brothers and sisters.) They were trying to protect Jesus because He wasn't eating and caring for Himself. As crowds surrounded Him, they felt He was working himself into a frenzy, maybe even losing His mind in His zeal to heal and teach everyone. They were worried about Him, especially when the scribes began accusing Him of being able to cast out demons only because Satan Himself possessed him.

Nonsense! This was far from the truth, and Jesus quickly stood up for Himself. Jesus instructed that He is the Conqueror of the Devil, and anyone who deliberately refuses to accept His power, mercy, forgiveness, and salvation blasphemes the Holy Spirit. This hardness of heart and unwillingness to repent will not be forgiven but will lead one to Hell for eternity.

It's important to remember that God's forgiveness

is always available to us, even when we make mistakes or speak harshly in our frustration. He will continue to pursue us until our last breath. The unforgivable sin of blasphemy against the Holy Spirit is for those who deliberately reject God and refuse His love and mercy by not repenting.

Was Jesus putting down His own family in this Gospel scene? No! Jesus holds out His welcoming arms to all who have faith in Him and trust in the Father's Holy Will. All Christian believers are adopted into His faith family as

> brothers and sisters of Christ. Faith in Christ the Living Word and sincerely seeking and accepting God's Holy Will bind Christians together as a family. What a gift!

Reflect & Discuss:


Do you often examine your heart and seek repentance and forgiveness for your sins in the Sacrament of Reconciliation?

LOSING A LOVED ONE TO SUICIDE

I have been writing on suicide for nearly forty years. I do so because suicide is generally misunderstood, badly misunderstood. Moreover, perhaps more than any other form of death, suicide leaves those who are left behind with a heavy burden of sadness, hurt, and guilt.

Four things need always to be said upfront about suicide:

First, suicide is a disease, perhaps the most misunderstood of all diseases. In most cases, the death is not freely chosen. When people die from heart attacks, strokes, cancer, AIDS, or accidents, they die against their will. The same is true for suicide, except that in the case of suicide, the breakdown is emotional rather than physical – an emotional stroke, an emotional cancer, a breakdown of the emotional immune system, an emotional fatality.

And this is not an analogy. Suicide is a disease. Most people who die by suicide die against their will. They only want to end a pain which can no longer be endured, akin to someone jumping to his death out of a burning building because his clothes are on fire.

Second, we should not worry unduly about the eternal salvation of a suicide victim, believing (as we used to) that suicide is the ultimate act of despair and something God will not forgive. God is infinitely understanding, loving, and gentle. We need not worry about the fate of anyone, no matter the cause of death, who exits this world broken, oversensitive, gentle, overwrought, and emotionally crushed. God has a special love for the broken and the crushed.

However, knowing all of this doesn't necessarily take away our pain (and anger) at losing someone to suicide because faith and understanding aren't always meant to take away our pain but rather to give us hope, vision, and support as we walk within our pain.

Third, we should not torture ourselves with guilt and second-guessing when we lose a loved one to suicide. "Where did I let this person down? If only I had been there? What if?" It is natural to be haunted by the thought, "if only I'd been there at the right time." Rarely would this have made a difference. Indeed, most of the time, we weren't there for the exact reason that the person who fell victim to this disease did not want us to be there. He or she picked the moment, the spot, and the means so that we wouldn't be there. Suicide is a disease that seems to pick its victim precisely in such a way so as to exclude others and their attentiveness. This is not an excuse for insensitivity, but a healthy check against false guilt and painful second-guessing.

We're human beings, not God. People die of illness and accidents all the time and sometimes all the love and attentiveness in the world cannot prevent a loved one from dying. As a mother who lost a child to suicide writes: *"The will to save a life does not constitute the power to prevent a death."*

And so, we must forgive ourselves for our human inadequacy vis-à-vis having lived with someone in suicidal depression. But that is not easy, as this man who lost his wife to suicide attests: "My wife had been unhappy and depressed for so long that I pray that she is now finally at peace. At least once a week for the past four or five years, she would remark that she wanted to die. ... It's been hard for me to disentangle the role I played in her unhappiness. ... At a minimum, I will take to my grave the realization that I could have done more to keep her afloat. Over the past several years, instead of giving a pep talk to try to encourage her to see things in a more positive light, my default option had become avoidance and withdrawal. I had assumed that trying to dispel the fog of her depression only tended to make matters worse, at least for me, since I would often become the easier target for her anger/unhappiness."

That is a common guilt feeling shared by many who have lost someone to suicide, particularly a spouse. What needs to be understood is that the depressed person's anger is most often focused precisely on someone whom they trust and are very close to because that is the only safe place where they can unload their anger (without the other reciprocating). Consequently, the person who is the target of that anger will often escape by avoidance and withdrawal – with the resulting guilt feelings afterwards.

Fourth, when we lose loved ones to suicide, one of our tasks is to work at redeeming their memory by putting their lives back into a perspective so that the manner of their death doesn't forever taint their memory. Don't take down their photographs, don't speak in hushed tones about their life and death, don't put a permanent asterisk beside their names. Their lives are not to be judged through the unfortunate prism of their deaths. Redeem their memory.
