

A Note From Father Tom

Dear Friends,

Today's gospel tells familiar parables of being lost and found. Jesus constantly reminds us how, no matter what, God always continues to seek us. We keep needing to hear that message. Our loving God never gives up on us! So, let's not let God see a "stiff-necked people" as described in today's first reading, but rather let us be like Paul who says in today's second reading, *I am grateful to him who has strengthened me, Christ Jesus our Lord.*

Today is Catechetical Sunday. I've asked our Religious Education Team to give a little overview in today's bulletin of what's new in Religious Ed. Many thanks to all those involved in faith formation, sharing that most precious gift of faith with our young ones, helping then fall in love with and be captured by the gospel message of Jesus.

We will soon resume the ministry of helping our young ones meet Jesus in the Sunday Gospels. As you know and have seen in former bulletins, age appropriate reflections are prepared for them. Perhaps you might like to join our "Barnabas Ministry". The name Barnabas means 'son of encouragement'. Those involved in the Barnabas Ministry write notes of encouragement in response to the reflections handed in by the young ones. If you've done so before and would like to assist again, please leave your name and number at the rectory. If you might like to join this ministry, a very brief informational meeting will be held on Tuesday, October 1st, at 10am and at 7pm in the Philip and James Room. October 1st is the feast of St. Therese of the Child Jesus, who is known for her "little ways" of serving the Lord. The Barnabas Ministry is clearly an example of her "little ways".

Other "little ways" of serving also exist! We are in need of Catechists for our Special Needs Religious Education Program held on Saturday mornings here in the school building. All materials are provided for you, and the blessings abound when serving the Lord in this wonderful ministry. We also seek your assistance in our Children's Liturgy of the Word Ministry. Perhaps once a month, or once every other month, assisting at either the Saturday 5pm or Sunday 10am would be a great help. What's involved is simply adult supervision to assist the catechist as he/she gives the lesson. This "little way" helps our young ones fall in love with Jesus. Please leave your name and number at the rectory.

Today and next weekend our new Youth Leaders will speak at Mass, welcoming high school teens to join in this year's Youth Ministry Program. And I am delighted to let you know that Dominick Avento, who for the past years has awakened the hearts of our seventh and eighth graders in Religious Education, has assumed the position of Interim Youth Minister!

"Andiamo fratelli"! Come on friends! I look forward to sharing with you in our upcoming Italian feast set for Saturday, October 26th. It promises to be multo bene, much like our recent St. Patrick's Party. More information to follow in next weeks bulletin!



The feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross celebrates two historical events: the discovery of the True Cross by Saint Helena, the mother of the Emperor Constantine, in 320 under the temple of Venus in Jerusalem, and the dedication in 335 of the basilica and shrine built on Calvary by Constantine, which mark the site of the Crucifixion.

However the feast, more than anything else, is a celebration and commemoration of God's greatest work: his salvific death on the Cross and His Resurrection, through which death was defeated and the doors to Heaven opened.





Religious Education New Year Update

As we enter the 2019-2020 year, there are going to be some new changes to our Religious Education program. Last year we changed our Communion I (grade 1) program. The children were divided into 2 groups which met on either Tuesday or Wednesday in the beautiful Bethany Center. All the children were taught as a group. It proved to be very successful, so we will continue the same format this year and will stay with Our Sunday Visitor, Alive in Christ series.

Because of the success of that program, this year all Communion II (grade 2) children will meet in the auditorium on Mondays. As a group, they will be presented with a video from the Dynamic Catholic: The Blessed Program, followed by an introduction to the lesson. They will then proceed, with their individual catechist to a quiet area to complete the lesson.

In looking at the characteristics of our 6th grade students, we also decided to change the format of that program to make it more appropriate for their needs. This group will be meeting on Tuesdays, in either the Bethany Center or the Auditorium, first as a large group to hear and be introduced to the lesson for that week. We will be using a brandnew program from Our Sunday Visitor: Alive in Christ. Our first booklet is entitled Jesus Christ and then we will move into the next booklet entitled The Kingdom of God. In addition to the large group lesson, the students will then be assigned to individual catechists who will work in smaller groups to provide follow up activities to the main lesson. We will also be involved in outreach to the larger community throughout the year. We are very excited about this change.

Following on the success of catechetical model developed for the 1^{st} and 2^{nd} Grade Communion classes last year, this year's 7^{th} grade (Confirmation I) class will begin using a similar 2-year format. The Diocese of Rockville Centre supports this approach as several parishes across Long Island have found it worked beautifully.

The Master Catechist format allows one trained catechist to teach the entire grade, every week. The lesson is prepared by the Master Catechist for the students and supported by 4 to 5 facilitating Catechists, who the students will be divided among, as smaller working groups, where facilitator-student discussion/clarification can take place and student-student interactions can develop. The groups then return to the main catechist for instruction and prayers.

Religious Education Ministry

Catechists are needed for our Special Needs Religious Education Ministry who touch the lives, minds and hearts of our Religious Education Students and families who may have special needs.

This extraordinary program is held on Saturdays, from 9am –9:45am here within the school building. All lesson materials are provided as well as support to meet the needs of our students and families.

Classes will begin on Saturday, October 5th, 2019

We ask that you kindly and prayerfully consider this wonderful opportunity.





A Puzzling Parable

This Week's Readings at Mass


- ► Amos 8:4-7 Against greed
- ▶ 1 Timothy 2:1-8 Conduct of men and women
- ► Luke 16:1-13 or 16:10-13 The dishonest steward

The first reading from the prophet Amos sounds a clear conviction against those who purposefully cheat, extort, and take advantage of the poor, seemingly without remorse. Sadly, that kind of injustice was common back then, as it still is today. Old Testament prophets like Amos regularly named economic injustice when they saw it. In the Gospel reading today, Jesus picks up on the prophetic tradition, preaching about appropriate and inappropriate uses of money. In Luke, more than any other Gospel, Jesus continually hammers home warnings about the seductive power of money.

The first section of today's Gospel, the parable about the dishonest steward, is a hard one to swallow if taken at face value. Biblical scholars still debate Jesus' meaning since it seems unlikely he would have commended the unsavory behavior of the steward who so blatantly cheats his master. (Although it is quite possible the master was extorting his debtors in the first place by charging extremely high interest rates—a common practice even though Jewish law forbid charging interest.) The most common interpretation is that Jesus is calling for his followers to act as decisively as the steward did in a time of crisis, not calling them to dishonesty. His call for prudence points out that disciples need to stretch themselves by showing greater dedication and commitment to the life of discipleship than the "children of this world" who invest themselves in making money and pursuing security in any manner possible.

If we let go of puzzling over this strange parable that seems so contradictory

to Iesus'

The Scent of Humility

According to Isaac the Syrian, a famous 7th Century bishop and theologian, a person who's genuinely humble gives off a certain scent that other people will sense and that even animals will pick up, so that wild animals, including snakes, will fall under its spell and never harm that person.

Here's his logic: A humble person, he believes, has recovered the smell of paradise and in the presence of such a person one does not feel judged and has nothing to fear, and this holds true even for animals. They feel safe around a humble person and are drawn to him or her. No wonder people like Francis of Assisi could talk to birds and befriend wolves.

But, beautiful as this all sounds, is this a pious fairytale or is it a rich, archetypal metaphor? I like to think it's the latter, this is a rich metaphor, and perhaps even something more. Humility, indeed, does have a smell, the smell of the earth, of the soil, and of paradise.

But how? How can a spiritual quality give off a physical scent?

Well, we're psychosomatic, creatures of both body and soul. Thus, in us, the physical and the spiritual are so much part of one and the same substance that it's impossible to separate them out from each other. To say that we're body and soul is like saying sugar is white and sweet and that whiteness and sweetness can never be put into separate piles. They're both inside the sugar. We're one substance, inseparable, body and soul, and so we're always both physical and spiritual. So, in fact, we do *feel* physical things spiritually, just as we *smell* spiritual things through our physical senses. If this is true, and it is, then, yes, humility does give off a scent that can be sensed physically and Isaac the Syrian's concept is more than just a metaphor.

But it's also a metaphor: The word *humility* takes its root in the Latin word, *humus*, meaning soil, ground, and earth. If one goes with this definition then the most humble person you know is the most-earthy and most-grounded person you know. To be humble is to have one's feet firmly planted on the ground, to be in touch with the earth, and to carry the smell of the earth. Further still, to be humble is to take one's rightful place as a piece of the earth and not as someone or something separate from it.

The renowned mystic and scientist, Pierre Teilhard de Chardin, expressed this sometimes in his prayers. During the years when, as paleontologist, he worked for long stretches in the isolated deserts of China he would sometimes compose prayers to God in a form he called, *A Mass for the World*. Speaking to God, as a priest, he would identify his voice with that of the earth itself, as that place within physical creation where the earth itself, the soil of the earth, could open itself and speak to God. As a priest, he didn't speak *for* the earth; he spoke *as* the earth, giving it voice, in words to this effect:

Lord, God, I stand before you as a microcosm of the earth itself, to give it voice: See in my openness, the world's openness, in my infidelity, the world's infidelity; in my sincerity, the world's sincerity, in my hypocrisy, the world's hypocrisy; in my generosity, the world's generosity in my attentiveness, the world's attentiveness, in my distraction, the world's distraction; in my desire to praise you, the world's desire to praise you, and in my self-preoccupation, the world's forgetfulness of you. For I am of the earth, a piece of earth, and the earth opens or closes to you through my body, my soul, and my voice.

This is humility, an expression of genuine humility. Humility should never be confused, as it often is, with a wounded self-image, with an excessive reticence, with timidity and fear, or with an overly sensitive self-awareness. Too common is the notion that a humble person is one who is self-effacing to a fault, who deflects praise (even when it's deserved), who is too shy to trust opening himself or herself in intimacy, or who is so fearful or self-conscious and worried about being shamed so as to never step forward and offer his or her gifts to the community. These can make for a gentle and self-effacing person, but because we are denigrating ourselves when to deny our own giftedness, our humility is false, and deep-down we know it, and so this often makes for someone who nurses some not-so-hidden angers and is prone to being passive aggressive.

The most humble person you know is the person who's the most-grounded, that is, the person who knows she's not the center of the earth but also knows that she isn't a second-rate piece of dirt either. And that person will give off a scent that carries both the fragrance of paradise (of divine gift) as well as the smell of the earth.
