#### Father Tom's Letter

Dear Friends,

Have you ever wondered what happens after death? Most of us have at one time or other. In today's gospel, the Sadducees try to impose their vision of the afterlife on Jesus. How does Jesus answer them? Here are some reflections of Fr. Jude Siciliano, OP,

Jesus responds to them by saying, in effect, "You have no idea what resurrection means." Jesus doesn't draw a picture depicting the next life, he doesn't say anything about pearly gates, golden streets and celestial thrones. In other words he doesn't take things from this life and put them, in an improved version, into the next. Instead of talking about things, he talks about <u>relationships</u> — our relationship with God and one another...

What is Jesus asking of us? To have faith in God and God's unbreakable covenant with us. God loves us now and that love will see us through the passage from this life to the next.... What difference does our faith in the resurrection have for us now? It helps us look at life through "resurrection eyes."....Resurrection eyes give us a new focus on life as we grow in appreciation for others as also loved by God. We don't measure another by their achievements, or their possessions, but because they too are children of God.

While the next life will certainly be dramatically different from this one - something from this life will be the same. We will continue to be, what Jesus calls us in the gospel today, "Children of God." That's the guarantee he offers us. Our strong ties with God here on earth will not be broken by death. God has made a covenant with us and so we will never be separated from God.

This weekend we renew ourselves as a praying community. All of us are involved in Liturgical Ministry as we gather to voice our praise and thanks to God. There are also those involved in more formal roles at worship whose commitment to serve assists all of us at prayer. In the name of the parish, I extend thanks to each of you for your ministry to us, the Body of Christ. Let us continue to pray for and with one another.

During the month of November we will continue to pray with grateful hearts for all who have gone before us. If you have not already done so, please add the names of your loved ones who have died to our Book of Remembrance.

As we commemorate Veterans' Day this Monday, we pray for all who have served our country, for all who are currently serving in the military, and for their families. May God give us the wisdom, vision and courage to bring about a just and lasting peace.

And, kind of an oldie, but...

A Sunday school teacher was discussing the Ten Commandments with her five and six year olds. After explaining the commandment to "honor thy father and thy mother, she asked, "Is there a commandment that teaches us how to treat our brothers and sisters?"

Without missing a beat one little boy answered, "Thou shall not kill."

#### **Third Order Secular Franciscans (OFS)**


In his *Letter to a Suffering Church*, Bishop Robert Barron reminds us that while our current suffering in the Church bears a painfully unique texture, the history of the Church has always suffered at the hands of the devil. Indeed, it is the very work of the devil to continue to look for ways to disarm us, to disillusion us, and to conquer us. Yet, his powers have always been limited and they always will be. Bishop Barron provides a litany of men and women who recognized and stood up against evil in whatever form it took. Saints Paul, Lucy, Agnes, Catherine of Sienna, and Francis of Assisi were all men and women who stood the ground of faith, despite whatever suffering the Church was experiencing in their times, to answer a call to follow Christ and to serve His Church as Apostles of Hope.

The Third Order Secular (*Ordo Franciscanus Saecularis*, in Latin), known as the Secular Franciscan Order, includes devout persons, both men and women, who want to make a difference. The Order was established by St. Francis of Assisi in 1221 as The Brothers and Sisters of Penance to meet the needs of lay people who sought to live the Gospel life while maintaining their lives in their families and among their communities. Today, the Order consists of people who are determined to improve their lives and the lives of others in accordance with the Gospel by following the example and lessons of St. Francis of Assisi. We each serve the Church in the ways that Christ and Francis direct us. The Spiritual and Corporeal Acts of Mercy offer an abundant number of possibilities for every one of us. While members do not live together as priests, sisters, or brothers do, they do gather together in Fraternities on a regular basis for prayer, study, discussion, and support. Because it is a recognized religious order of the Church, the process of becoming a Secular Franciscan involves a commitment of 18 to 36 months in formation. If their discernment is true and God wills it, Seculars ultimately make a public, sacred profession and are consecrated by the Church to live out the Gospel according to the example of St. Francis. There are nearly 13,000 life-professed Secular Franciscans in the United States today.

The St. Lawrence of Brindisi Fraternity gathers in the Parish Hall and Chapel of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Church on North Ocean Ave. in Patchogue on the first Sunday of every month. 


After successfully completing his service as a student lector, Aidan has responded to the call of being an Apostle of Hope and has decided to join the Lector ministry.



#### **Not Who They Expected**

This Week's Readings at Mass

- ▶ 2 Samuel 5:1-3 David anointed king
- ► Colossians 1:12-20 Christ is before and above all things
- ► Luke 23:35-43 The crucified king

On this feast day of Christ the King, the first reading tells us of King David's anointing as the king of Israel. He was the one that unified the twelve tribes of Israel and brought them together as a people for the first time. Ever since, he has been upheld as *the* preeminent king in Jewish history.

Many of the misunderstandings about Jesus' identity stem from the fact that he did not fit the description of what the Jews were expecting in a king who was the "son of David." They expected a military warrior who would save them from the oppression of whoever the current ruling empire was. They thought he would usher in an everlasting reign of national peace. They certainly didn't expect a king like Jesus who sided with the poor and the outcast and had no patience for social climbing. They never expected a king who would resist all manner of violence, even to the point of accepting suffering on the cross rather than lashing out in retaliation.

At the heart of the celebration of Christ the King (which always falls on the last Sunday of the year before Advent begins) is an understanding of Jesus as a king who talked and acted very differently from the descendant of David whom the Jews expected. When Jesus walked the earth, Jews were looking forward to a king who would once again unify their country and liberate them from the world powers who historically oppressed them. In a world where "might makes right," it would be natural

would be a powerful political figure who would lead the Jews in throwing off Roman rule and reestablishing national independence. Such a king would naturally

to presume that the coming Savior

enjoy the prestige, wealth, and trappings of a worldly kingdom.



No wonder so many Jews had trouble coming to terms with Jesus' behavior or flatly denied that he was their expected savior. No wonder Jewish rulers, Roman soldiers, and a condemned criminal mocked Jesus as "the King of the Jews" at his crucifixion. Jesus rejected any nationalism that included violence or oppression, and he preached love of enemies instead of the death of enemies. His refusal to play the part of a worldly king went so far that he refused to use his divine powers to save himself from horrific suffering.

#### Faith and Dying

We tend to nurse a certain naiveté about what faith means in the face of death. The common notion among us as Christians is that if someone has a genuine faith she should be able to face death without fear or doubt. The implication then of course is that having fear and doubt when one is dying is an indication of a weak faith. While it's true that many people with a strong faith do face death calmly and without fear, that's not always the case, nor necessarily the norm.

We can begin with Jesus. Surely he had real faith and yet, in the moments just before his death, he called out in both fear and doubt. His cry of anguish, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me", came from a genuine anguish that was not, as we sometimes piously postulate, uttered for divine effect, not really meant, but something for us to hear. Moments before he died, Jesus suffered real fear and real doubt. Where was his faith? Well, that depends upon how we understand faith and the specific modality it can take on in our dying.

In her famous study of the stages of dying, Elizabeth Kubler-Ross, suggests there are five stages we undergo in the dying process: *Denial, Anger, Bargaining, Depression, Acceptance*. Our first response to receiving a terminal diagnosis is denial — *This is not happening!* Then when we have to accept that it is happening our reaction is anger — *Why me!* Eventually anger gives way to bargaining — *How much time can I still draw out of this?* This is followed by depression andfinally, when nothing serves us any longer, there's acceptance — *I'm going to die.* This is all very true.

But in a deeply insightful book, *The Grace in Dying*, Kathleen Dowling Singh, basing her insights upon the experience of sitting at the bedside of many dying people, suggests there are additional stages: *Doubt, Resignation, and Ecstasy*. Those stages help shed light on how Jesus faced his death.

The night before he died, in Gethsemane, Jesus accepted his death, clearly. But that acceptance was not yet full resignation. That only took place the next day on the cross in a final surrender when, as the Gospels put it, he bowed his head and gave over his spirit. And, just before that, he experienced an awful fear that what he had always believed in and taught about God was perhaps not so. Maybe the heavens were empty and maybe what we deem as God's promises amount only to wishful thinking.

But, as we know, he didn't give into that doubt, but rather, inside of its darkness, gave himself over in trust. Jesus died in faith – though not in what we often naively believe faith to be. To die in faith does not always mean that we die calmly, without fear and doubt.

For instance, the renowned biblical scholar, Raymond E. Brown, commenting on the fear of death inside the community of the Beloved disciple, writes: "The finality of death and the uncertainties it creates causes trembling among those who have spent their lives professing Christ. Indeed, among the small community of Johannine disciples, it was not unusual for people to confess that doubts had come into their minds as they encountered death. ...The Lazarus story is placed at the end of Jesus' public ministry in John to teach us that when confronted with the visible reality of the grave, all need to hear and embrace the bold message that Jesus proclaimed: 'I am the life.' ... For John, no matter how often we renew our faith, there is the supreme testing by death. Whether the death of a loved one or one's own death, it is the moment when one realizes that it all depends on God. During our lives we have been able to shield ourselves from having to face this in a raw way. Confronted by death, mortality, all defenses fall away."

Sometimes people with a deep faith face death in calm and peace. But sometimes they don't and the fear and doubt that threatens them then is not necessarily a sign of a weak or faltering faith. It can be the opposite, as we see in Jesus. Inside a person of faith, fear and doubt in the face of death is what the mystics call 'the dark night of the spirit" ... and this is what's going on inside that experience: The raw fear and doubt we are experiencing at that time make it impossible for us to mistake our own selves and our own life-force for God. When we have to accept to die in trust inside of what seems like absolute negation and can only cry out in anguish to an apparent emptiness then it is no longer possible to confuse God with our own feelings and ego. In that, we experience the ultimate purification of soul. We can have a deep faith and still find ourselves with doubt and fear in the face of death. Just look at Jesus
