The Pastoral Letter from Rev. Sean Magaldi

My Dear Friends in Jesus Christ and Our Blessed Mother,

Thank you for your prayers for the fruitfulness of the SEEK Conference. For those who are unaware, I was with around 50 students from Adelphi, Hofstra, Long Island University, and Stony Brook at the SEEK Conference in Washington, DC. The conference comes at a wonderful time as it overlaps with the feast of the Epiphany. We celebrate the Epiphany on Sunday, 1/5.

What does the feat of the Epiphany mean for us as Catholics? One of the meanings is that God reveals Himself in the person of Jesus Christ to all the nations, not just the Jewish people. We see this in the Wise Men from the East. The Wise Men were first drawn to Christ not by a prophet but by something natural: a star. When we examine the people at the birth of Jesus, we see all sorts of different people.

One of the beautiful things about the SEEK Conference is that I met people from all walks of life who came together to encounter Jesus. Like the shepherds and the Wise Men, students at the SEEK Conference are lifelong Catholics, recent converts, people questioning their beliefs, and everything in between. Christ is the light of the world, the light for all the world.

Christ continues to draw people to Himself. A reporter once asked Pope Benedict how many ways there are to get to God, and his answer was, "As many ways as there are people." God knows what we need to grow closer to Him, and in addition to the objective truths of our faith, God draws us to Himself in the ways that we specifically need. Thousands of students at the SEEK Conference came for different reasons, and many encountered Jesus on a deep level, some even in a way that would change their lives forever. Please pray for all students who attended SEEK, especially those from our diocese.

A Weekly Reflection from Sr. Theresita Donach, CSFN

My Dear Friends,

And so we are now into the new year. Since I had the privilege of being in Rome for the opening of the Jubilee Year of Hope, I thought I would share with you part of the message Pope Francis gave at the opening of the Holy Door. Some of you may have heard it and some may have read his message, but I think it is worth repeating as we enter into this exciting yet challenging time in our history. May the words of our Holy Father stir into flame a desire to become pilgrims of hope.

Dear sisters and brothers, happy Christmas!

The mystery that never ceases to amaze and move us was renewed this night: the Virgin Mary gave birth to Jesus, the Son of God, wrapped him in swaddling clothes and laid him in a manger. That is how the shepherds of Bethlehem, filled with joy, found him, as the angels sang: "Glory to God and peace to men" (cf. Lk 2:6-14). Peace to men and women.

This event, which took place over two thousand years ago, is indeed made new thanks to the Holy Spirit, the same Spirit of Love and Life who made fruitful the womb of Mary and from her human flesh formed Jesus. Today, amid the travail of our times, the eternal Word of salvation is once more truly made incarnate, and speaks to every man and woman, to the whole world. This is the message: "I love you, I forgive you; come back to me, the door of my heart is open for you!"

Brothers and sisters, the door of God's heart is always open; let us return to him! Let us go back to the heart that loves and forgives us! Let us be forgiven by him; let us be reconciled with him! God always forgives! God forgives everything. Let us allow ourselves to be forgiven by him. This is the meaning of the Holy Door of the Jubilee, which I opened last night here in Saint Peter's Basilica: it represents Jesus, the Door of salvation open for all. Jesus is the Door; the Door that the Father of mercies has opened in the midst of our world, in the midst of history, so that all of us can return to him. We are all like lost sheep; we need a Shepherd and a Door to return to the house of the Father. Jesus is that Shepherd; Jesus is the Door.

Brothers and sisters, do not be afraid! The Door is open, the door is wide open! There is no need to knock on the door. It is open. Come! Let us be reconciled with God, and then we will be reconciled with ourselves and able to be reconciled with one another, even our enemies. God's mercy can do all things. It unties every knot; it tears down every wall of division; God's mercy dispels hatred and the spirit of revenge. Come! Jesus is the Door of Peace.

Often we halt at the threshold of that Door; we lack the courage to cross it, because it challenges us to examine our lives. Entering through that Door calls for the sacrifice involved in taking a step forward, a small sacrifice. Taking a step towards something so great calls us to leave behind our disputes and divisions, and surrendering ourselves to the outstretched arms of the Child who is the Prince of Peace. This Christmas, at the beginning of the Jubilee Year, I invite every individual, and all peoples and nations, to find the courage needed to walk through that Door, to become pilgrims of hope, to silence the sound of arms and overcome divisions!

Take some time this week and reflect on what our Pope is asking of us, of you. It can be a very Hope filled time if we but cross over into the open door of God's Love.

- b. a celebration of the Word of God;
- c. the Liturgy of the Hours
- d. the Way of the Cross;
- e. the Marian Rosary;
- a penitential celebration, which ends with the individual confessions of the penitents.



By devoutly visiting one of the Diocesan Sacred Sites

For a suitable period of time, engage in Eucharistic adoration and meditation, concluding with the Our Father, the Apostles Creed, and the Hail Mary.



Those who are sick or cannot participate for serious reasons, can obtain the Jubilee Indulgence

If, united in spirit with the faithful taking part in person, they recite the Our Father, the Apostles Creed and the Jubilee Prayer, offering up their sufferings or the hardships of their lives.



Carry out a corporal or spiritual work of mercy



Carry out a work of Penance

Such as abstaining, fasting, donating money to the poor, by supporting works of a religious or social nature, especially in support of the defence, protection and quality of life in all its phases, or by volunteering free time to activities that are of service to the community.



Participate in Missions, Spiritual Exercises or formation activities,

with a devout spirit, on the documents of the Second Vatican Council and the Catechism of the Catholic Church, held in a church or other suitable place.





Gospel - Luke 3: 15-16, 21-22

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke
