The Pastoral Letter from Rev. Sean Magaldi

My Dear Friends in Jesus Christ and Our Blessed Mother,

As we approach the election of a new pope, the conclave will be front and center on people's minds. First and foremost, unless you are watching EWTN or Catholic Faith Network, I wouldn't entirely trust what the secular media says about the conclave. Additionally, the movie Conclave does not accurately portray what occurs at a conclave. The film is a work of fiction written and directed by people who do not necessarily have the Church and her teachings in mind. The portrayal of the Church in film often focuses on intrigue and politics and overlooks the profound prayer and discernment that defines the actual process of a papal conclave.

Although the cardinals electing our new pope are human and, therefore, affected by the reality of sin, we know the Holy Spirit is at work. There is a difference between God's active will and His permissive will. Therefore, we must pray for the cardinals that they select the pope that God actively wills. We trust that the process, which is deeply rooted in tradition, has strict rules to maintain secrecy, remove outside influence, and foster a spiritual atmosphere focused on God's will rather than human ambition. Ballots are cast in multiple rounds, with a two-thirds majority required for a successful election. Once a new pope is chosen, white smoke rises from the chapel's chimney, signaling the decision to the world.

We want to avoid politics as well. The Church is a divine institution in addition to a human institution. In this light, the election of a pope is not just an organizational decision but a moment of grace for the entire Church. As a result, we want to avoid thinking about politics like liberal and conservative or Democrat and Republican. Whatever happens, we know the gates of hell will never prevail against the Church (Mt. 16:18). Finally, let us ask our Blessed Mother to pray for the Church as well.



As I continue to minister at the parish, I have the opportunity to meet many individuals. Wisdom and age have afforded me the gift to recognize the Gifted Givers and the Grouchy Grabbers. When I look at what I have in my life, do I see the abundance, or do I have scarcity vision? Friends, I say it again, we have been blessed with abundance in our lives. The struggle is that sometimes we forget to hear the words of the Shepherd "I have come so that you may have life and have it more abundantly."

Spend some time this week listening and then listing ALL the abundance in your life, no matter what form it takes. I think you will find yourself in a much happier and positive place. IF not, then try it for another week...practice makes perfect!

On Sunday, May 11th, we celebrate Mother's Day and if anyone understands sharing abundantly it is a mom and mom like figures. Let us pray for them, living and deceased and thank God for their presence in our life. May you have an abundant week!


