

The Pastoral Letter from Rev. Sean Magaldi

My Dear Friends in Jesus Christ and Our Blessed Mother,

Habemus Papam! Cardinal Robert Prevost has been elected as pope, and he has taken the name Leo XIV. He is the first pope from the United States—a native of Chicago, and allegedly a Cubs fan; however, I saw a report yesterday that he's a White Sox fan. While researching Pope Leo XIV, I found his episcopal motto: In illo Uno unum. The phrase translates to "In Him, One in Unity." It's a part of a quote from St. Augustine.

As an Augustinian, Pope Leo would have a quote from St. Augustine as his episcopal motto. The larger quote is, "We are many, but in [Christ], we are one." What I love most about the Catholic Church is that it is an umbrella that covers a diverse group of people. It doesn't matter what country we are from, or state in life (i.e., priest, religious, married, or single), how much money we have, etc. What unites each one of us as Catholics is Christ.

We are brothers and sisters in Christ, and as a result, we are one in Him. We always want to keep that in mind, as the world will try to define Pope Leo's pontificate. Like I wrote regarding the conclave, we want to believe the Church is divinely instituted and doesn't fit neatly in a liberal and conservative paradigm. Our Lord says, "And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my [Church], and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it" (Mt 16:18). Long live Pope Leo XIV.

On a parish note, I was recently informed that Fr. Joe will leave us in June. He will move to St. Joseph's in Garden City and serve as the associate pastor. We are grateful for all the wonderful things Fr. Joe has done for SS. Philip and James. We will all miss him. Fr. Martin Adu Gyamfi, currently serving at Our Lady of Grace, will be our new associate pastor. We look forward to welcoming him to this wonderful parish.

Meet POPE LEO XIV!

Born: September 14, 1955

Ordained Priest: June 19, 1982

Appointed Cardinal by Pope Francis:

September 30, 2023

Elected Pope: May 8, 2025



On May 8, 2025, Cardinal Robert Francis Prevost, O.S.A., was elected the 267th pope, taking the name Pope Leo XIV.

Pope Leo was born September 14, 1955, in Chicago, Illinois. Before his election as pope, Cardinal Robert Francis Prevost served for over two decades in Peru. In 2014, Pope Francis appointed Cardinal Prevost as Apostolic Administrator of Callao. As a member of the Order of Saint Augustine (O.S.A.), he brings to the papacy decades of experience in missionary service, especially among the poor, marginalized, and migrants. He has been an advocate for ecclesial reform and deeper dialogue within the global Church.

He served as Prior General of the Augustinians from 2001 to 2013. Before becoming a bishop, he worked in Peru as a seminary professor, judicial vicar, parish pastor, and diocesan official. He was elevated to the College of Cardinals by Pope Francis on September 30, 2023. His prior roles include serving as Prefect of the Dicastery for Bishops from 2023 to 2025, where he played a key role in shaping episcopal leadership worldwide.



Pope Leo's First Steps as Pontiff: What to Expect from the Early Days of His Papacy

His First Words: The Urbi et Orbi Blessing

Pope Leo XIV delivered his first address from St. Peter's Basilica, known as the *Urbi et Orbi* ("to the city and to the world") blessing. The first words of this short, prayerful message, which he gave from the balcony of St. Peter's Basilica following the "*Habemus Papam!*" announcement, were "Peace be with all of you!" He continued by saying, "The world needs Christ's light. Humanity needs him to be the bridge so that God and his love can reach us."

These remarks set a tone of hope, reconciliation, and a focus on Christ as the source of unity and peace for humanity. Pope Leo XIV's initial address was resonant, highlighting both a blessing for all and the essential role of faith in bridging divisions and bringing God's love to the world.

His First Public Mass: The Inauguration

Within a week, and likely on Sunday, Pope Leo XIV will celebrate the Mass of Inauguration in St. Peter's Square, marking the formal start of his ministry. This Liturgy, attended by thousands, includes the bestowal of the Fisherman's Ring and pallium (symbols of papal authority). A private Mass with the cardinals in the Sistine Chapel often precedes it.

His challenges are just as difficult as those of the apostles. And yet he urges us to move forward. And to include everyone on the journey. The more I think about it the more I wonder how he will respond to all that is presented to him, all that will demand his time, knowledge, and spirit.

How does this election affect you and your day-to-day living? Where are you at during this season before Pentecost? Will you allow the Holy Spirit to fill you so much that you are ready to live the passionate life of Christ that He desires of us? Will you be His hands and raise people up? Will you be His feet by walking with those who are experiencing difficult times? There is no heart or smile but yours, so will you bring the spirit of love and compassion to those who have been disregarded as unworthy? Will your arms embrace everyone?

I don't have the answers, but Pope Leo XIV can't do all that will be asked of him by himself. He will need our support through prayer and a renewed sense of just what it means to have been Baptized into this Catholic Faith, this Royal Family. Jesus came so we could have life and life to the fullest. May your life and week be filled with God's love!

The Regina Caeli

The Regina Caeli is a 12th century hymn used by the Church during the Easter Season, often after night prayer. Recently Pope Leo XIV sang it at his Sunday Audience.



alle-lú-ia: O-ra pro no-bis De- um, alle-lú- ia.

Queen of Heaven, rejoice, alleluia. For He whom you did merit to bear, alleluia. Has risen, as he said, alleluia. Pray for us to God, alleluia.

While the authorship of the Regina Caeli is unknown, the hymn has been traced back to the twelfth century. It was in Franciscan use, after Compline, in the first half of the following century. There is a legend that says St. Gregory the Great (d. 604) heard the first three lines chanted by angels on a certain Easter morning in Rome while he walked barefoot in a great religious procession and that the Saint thereupon added the fourth line: "Ora pro nobis Deum. Alleluia."

Gospel - John 14: 23-29

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Jesus said to his disciples:

"Whoever loves me will keep my word,

and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him.

Gospel Reflection Process

- Pray a simple prayer to the Holy Spirit: "Speak, Lord, your servant is listening."
- Read the passage slowly. As you listen, ask in silence, "Lord, what are you saying to me in this passage?"
- Listen for a word or phrase that calls your attention or touches your heart.
- Share a brief story or experience of how the word or phrase connects to your life at this
 moment.
- Ask in silence, "Lord, what do you want me to do?" Share what Jesus is inviting you to do.
