The Pastoral Letter from Rev. Sean Magaldi

My Dear Friends in Christ and Our Blessed Mother,


In the Spring Semester of 2006, I went on a retreat at the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception in Huntington. On Saturday night of the retreat, the priest leading the retreat informed us that we would have Adoration. Msgr. McDonald, who would eventually become a mentor, was the rector of the seminary. He led the hour of Eucharistic Adoration. When he placed the Blessed Sacrament into the monstrance, a gold vessel that resembled the sun, I looked at Jesus, and it finally clicked: He is truly present in the Eucharist.

That night was the first time I ever experienced Adoration. It was a night that changed my life forever. It is because of that night that I want to encourage our Monday Adoration. Thanks to the generosity of some parishioners, we can now sign up for specific slots. You remain free to come when you want, but we need to fill up the slots to keep Adoration going. We cannot leave Jesus unattended. Signing up is very easy. You can sign up manually in the book by the prayer basket, visit this website: https://stsphilipjames.weadorehim.com/en, or scan the QR code on the poster.

Eucharistic Adoration can transform lives. I can write more about what we can do at Adoration at a later date, but until then, I want to quote Pope Benedict. In his apostolic exhortation "Sacramentum Caritatis" ("The Sacrament of Charity"), he reflects on the profound value of Eucharistic Adoration. Pope Benedict XVI writes, "The act of adoration outside Mass prolongs and intensifies all that takes place during the liturgical celebration itself" (SC, 66). Pope Benedict is helping us understand that Adoration extends the beauty and power of the Mass into our lives, fostering a deeper communion with the Lord outside of Mass.

He continues, "Only in Adoration can a profound and genuine reception mature. And it is precisely this personal encounter with the Lord that then strengthens the social mission contained in the Eucharist, which seeks to break down not only the walls that separate the Lord and ourselves, but also and especially the walls that separate us from one another." I encourage each of you to consider signing up for Adoration on Mondays. Just like He changed my life nearly twenty years ago, I know He can and will change yours.





Gospel Reflection

Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year C August 3, 2025

Gospel - Luke 12: 13-21

Reading of the Holy Gospel according to Luke

Someone in the crowd said to Jesus,
"Teacher, tell my brother to share the inheritance with me."
He replied to him, "Friend, who appointed me as your judge and arbitrator?"
Then he said to the crowd, "Take care to guard against all greed,
for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions."

Then he told them a parable.

"There was a rich man whose land produced a bountiful harvest. He asked himself, 'What shall I do, for I do not have space to store my harvest?'
And he said, 'This is what I shall do:
I shall tear down my barns and build larger ones.
There I shall store all my grain and other goods and I shall say to myself, "Now as for you, you have so many good things stored up for many years,

But God said to him,

rest, eat, drink, be merry!"

You fool, this night your life will be demanded of you; and the things you have prepared, to whom will they belong?' Thus will it be for all who store up treasure for themselves but are not rich in what matters to God."

The Gospel of the Lord.

Gospel Reflection Process

- Pray a simple prayer to the Holy Spirit: "Speak, Lord, your servant is listening."
- Read the passage slowly. As you listen, ask in silence, "Lord, what are you saying to me in this passage?"
- Listen for a word or phrase that calls your attention or touches your heart.
- Share a brief story or experience of how the word or phrase connects to your life at this moment.
- Ask in silence, "Lord, what do you want me to do?" Share what Jesus is inviting you to do.
