

The Pastoral Letter from Rev. Sean Magaldi

My Dear Friends in Jesus Christ and Our Blessed Mother,

On Monday, 8/25, the Responsorial Psalm was, "The Lord takes delight in his people." When you hear those words, what does that illicit inside of you? What emotions does it stir up? People often speak to me of the difficulty they face in believing that the Father delights in them.


Because of sin — whether the sins of others or our own — we don't view ourselves the way God sees us. We hyperfocus on our flaws and shortcomings, believing the lie that we are unlovable. How do we counteract these lies? If we have experienced psychological trauma, then seeking counseling from a mental health professional may be helpful. Sometimes the issue is more than just a spiritual one.

From a spiritual perspective, however, we want to spend time with the Lord. Reading Scripture is helpful, particularly the Gospel. We see how Jesus speaks, and as a result, it becomes easier to identify the lies. Spending time in prayer is also essential, particularly in Eucharistic Adoration. When we are in Adoration, we allow Jesus to delight in us as we sit before Him. When we spend time with the Lord, we begin to encounter and experience His delight slowly. We can also ask Him to reveal His love for us to us. The more we discover the love of God, the more we believe it.

I want to conclude with a painting that someone showed me a few years ago. It is titled "Father and Son" by John Koch. Here, we see a father, who appears to be a professional painter, stop what he is doing to look at his son, who is drawing on the floor. Their skills don't match, and what the son is drawing isn't as good as the painting his father is making, but the professional painter delights in his son anyway. Let's use this image to help us understand God's love.

OCIA PROGRAM STARTS IN SEPTEMBER

The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (formerly RCIA) is the process by which adults are gradually introduced to the Catholic faith and sacramental life.

This process is intended for:

- Unbaptized adults who seek to receive the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and the Holy Eucharist.
- Baptized non-Catholic Christians, who desire to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church.
- Baptized Catholics, who have not yet completed their sacraments of initiation (Confirmation and/or First Holy Communion).

Here at Saints Philip and James, the OCIA process begins in September and culminates at the Easter Vigil on April 4, 2026. If you know anyone —be it a neighbor, a friend, or a family member —who may be interested in this process, please share the program with them and ask them to **call the Parish Center at 631-584-5454** for more information. You may be doing them the greatest favor they have ever received.


the son, daughter, grandchild, or legal ward of a Knight of Columbus in good standing.

Gospel Reflection

Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year C September 7, 2025

Gospel - Luke 14: 25-33

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Great crowds were traveling with Jesus, and he turned and addressed them, "If anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple.

Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple.

Which of you wishing to construct a tower does not first sit down and calculate the cost to see if there is enough for its completion?

Otherwise, after laying the foundation

and finding himself unable to finish the work

the onlookers should laugh at him and say,

'This one began to build but did not have the resources to finish.'

Or what king marching into battle would not first sit down and decide whether with ten thousand troops

he can successfully oppose another king

advancing upon him with twenty thousand troops?

But if not, while he is still far away,

he will send a delegation to ask for peace terms.

In the same way, anyone of you who does not renounce all his Possessions cannot be my disciple."

The Gospel of the Lord.

Gospel Reflection Process

- Pray a simple prayer to the Holy Spirit: "Speak, Lord, your servant is listening."
- Read the passage slowly. As you listen, ask in silence, "Lord, what are you saying to me in this passage?"
- Listen for a word or phrase that calls your attention or touches your heart.
- Share a brief story or experience of how the word or phrase connects to your life at this moment.
- Ask in silence, "Lord, what do you want me to do?" Share what Jesus is inviting you to do.
